




Present Night Sky

Future Night Sky






The Competitiveness Pyramid




Regional Competitiveness

EU Comparisons (1)....island of Ireland one of the more affluent parts of the EU...




Regional Competitiveness

EU Comparisons (2)...but island is remoter and lacks lots of big cities...essential in driving regional competitiveness....




Main economic structures of the European territory




Spatial Strategies: key Interdependencies


- The international potential of the Dublin Belfast corridor (including intermediate areas (Newry-Dundalk))...

- Enhancing the range and depth of key datasets...





Concentration of people with skills...(2002 data)...




Places with higher proportions of immigrants...




The dependency of remoter areas on vulnerable economic activity....


Percentage Proportion distribution of the population whose Industry of Employment is : Agriculture, Hunting, Fishing and Forestry



The concentration in younger population....




The age dependency issue in remoter areas...




People in Rol seem to travel longer distances to work...

Current and committed road plans...






Areas 50k beyond motorways either existing/under construction...




Potential of the "Atlantic Gateways"....should this include the NW?...

- Major issues facing the island...
- Island has a one off chance in channelling and structuring considerable growth potential....
- Need to agree the key spatial planning priorities that have the potential to bed down competitiveness and drive the infrastructure investment agenda...
- Role that environmental qualities play in enhancing competitiveness and quality of life...and doing something about it...harnessing our assets positively and sustainably!
- Need for a strong east-west dimension...



Cross Border efforts to date:


- M1/A1 motorway: joint contract on £84m new road...
- Jointly operated "Enterprise" rail service...
- €7.7m (Rol) funding for City of Derry airport...
- Waste management eg: proposed all island waste paper mill award winning ad campaigns and white goods recycling (150,000 ytd)...
- River basin management SHARE project (Interreg funded)...
- Cross Border bodies: eg Waterways Ireland...
- Interreg funded cross border groups...
- Local (agency/local authority) co-operation eg roads...

Cross Border efforts continued:

- National (Rol) Patient Treatment Purchase Scheme...
- Centre of excellence for cancer treatment in NW Derry?...
- All island energy market by 2007...
- 3 electricity interconnectors...
- 2 gas pipeline connections...
- ESB (Rol) owned Coolkeeragh power station in Derry...
- Seaport capacity study (ongoing)...

- Future collaboration needs to be:




Challenges:

- Fast growing population (Rol net migration: c85,000pa)...
- Possibility of "8 million" by 2030?...
 - Urban Centres (circa 1.000)
- 100,000 housing completions N+S pa (UK: 170,000) + not all in right places
- Major waste management, river basin management issues...
- Need to co-ordinate significant infrastructure spend eg roads, water services, healthcare, communications...
- Need to strengthen spatial context...
- Need for more co-operation that is "fit for purpose"
- Key role for a spatial context...

Towards a Framework for Collaboration:

- What is emerging...3 Tiered approach...intergovernmental, regional, local...
- Flexible approach....criteria for selecting projects and activities...
- 3 initial priorities...
- Collaboration in development and implementation of sub-regional development strategies..northwest..Newry/Dundalk...
- Agreement on the key spatial development priorities to be reflected in the infrastructure investment agenda....thematic maps...
- Development of a comprehensive database to facilitate further excercises...






- Need to build on existing good co-operation between DEHLG and DRD...
- Implementation of investment plans (National Development Plan and Strategic Investment Board): major opportunity to link in spatial planning initiatives...
- Major need for local initiative and buy in: eg Newry Dundalk Twin
 City Strategy...
- Development of an annual work programme between the two Governments...
- Joint sponsorship of new research and data gathering...

- Island faces both significant opportunities but also significant challenges...
- There is a window of opportunity: next decade??
- There is much good practical co-operation...
- Spatial strategies do add up...
- Both Governments working towards a collaborative framework...
- Framework to build on existing inititiatives, establish criteria for new initiatives and establish a stronger spatial context for infrastructure co-ordination...
