


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# **1. Prevailing Situation**


#### Two economies with distinct attributes and performances

  - More to be done?





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
#### Figure 2 **Rail Network on the island of Ireland**

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






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#### Figure 4 Broadband Backbone Infrastructure on the Island of Ireland 2004










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
**Figure 5** Electricity Network on the Island of Ireland





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

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


Figure 8 Travel to Work Distance (Average) for the Island of Ireland 2001/2002





#### Closer integration of spatial planning, infrastructure and business growth requiring:


- Coherent management approach

### Set out proposals on 3 key elements


Regional and local spatial planning initiatives






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#### Figure 7 Higher Earners / Professionals Island of Ireland 2001/2002



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# 3.4 Framework for Collaboration: Action Agenda (1)

- Action agenda for government will require:
  - Endorsement of role and value of a collaborative framework
  - Specifications of framework
    - Using the research findings
    - Drawing on advice of national experts
    - Engaging with business and other stakeholders
  - Preparing framework
  - > Arrangements for driving process forward





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# Framework for Collaboration: Action Agenda (2)

#### Stakeholder engagement is essential

- New collaborative working relationships
- Include & energise a wider range of stakeholders

Focus on infrastructure to develop synergies



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
# 3.4 Framework for Collaboration: Action Agenda (3)

#### Establish an inclusive role for subregional networks to:

- Link more effectively to central government / mainstream thinking
- Interface with other representative agencies
- Contribute to joined-up planning and development
- Facilitate enhanced data and information
- Provide additional critical mass for funding of strategic projects

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Project areas: illustrative infrastructure projects






- Inform future investment programmes

- Feed into funding programmes


