Ensure 90% of large scale investment planning decisions are made within 6 months and applications with job creation potential are given additional weight

Faster Plans and Processing of Planning Applications

- Speedier, simpler, streamlined processes new development plan and development management systems.
- Focus on spatial planning place making
- Enhanced community involvement in development plan preparation and applications.





Fairer and Faster Appeals

- Appeals to be decided purely on material that was in front of planning authority when it made its original decision
- Appeal period reduced from 6 to 4 months



 Award of Costs – Allows the PAC to award costs in planning appeals where the unreasonable behaviour of one party puts other parties to unnecessary expense.



Simpler and Tougher Enforcement

 Period in which enforcement action can be taken changed to 5 years (previously 4 and 10 years)



- Introduction of Fixed Penalty Notices for failure to comply with enforcement or breach of condition notices
- Multiple fees for retrospective applications



Planning Functions Transferring to Councils

- Local development plans
- Most development management functions
- Enforcement
- Conservation
- Duty to further sustainable development and promote or improve wellbeing



What stays with DOE?
