Context

- Local government in Northern Ireland is facing a huge change programme, including transfer of Planning functions
- The system we inherit must be fit for purpose
- We must continue to develop a best practice approach
- We must address challenge through knowledge, experience and scrutiny





The Shift to Spatial Planning

- There has been a shift to a spatial planning approach in modern planning practice
- We need to co-ordinate and integrate government strategy at local level, to achieve a physical form for the vision for Northern Ireland set out by the Assembly, with a complementary local vision delivered locally.
- How to address the tensions between different strategies and policies?





Key needs

- We need to be objective, and have accurate, relevant information at our disposal, on which to base our decisions.
- We need to identify short, medium and long term objectives, and local strategies that complement and further develop regional and national policy.
- 3. We need to engage our businesses and communities, to develop a shared understanding of the needs of the local areas, and a shared vision for the future of those areas.





Key needs

- 4. We need to make sure that the community plan is a robust, evidence-based driver for the area plan —it is agreed that there should be a statutory connection between the two.
- 5. We need to take a lead role in encouraging the public service providers in our areas to work better together, for the benefit of the citizen.





Tools for the job

- Local knowledge is essential, but it is not enough
- Use the information we have to hand e.g. Northern Ireland
 Statistics and Research Agency Neighbourhood Information
 Service to develop an evidence base for our areas:
 - Newry and Mourne DC is working locally with partners
 - Councils in the Border regions are working over a wider area (NWRCBG SPACE-ial project, ICBAN spatial planning initiative)
- Learning from academics and others





Facing the challenge

- Eating the elephant one chunk at a time!

- · Gather the information needed to plan
- Engage the community, neighbouring councils, government
