- No clear vision of the public interest in the use and protection of Ireland's marine space
- Does not implement an ecosystem-based approach
- Risks becoming a development-led system


 Minimising impacts on vulnerable ecosystems

 A robust hierarchy of national, regional, and local plans is missing

 The MAP 2021 Act allows for subnational marine plans (DMAPs) but does not require their preparation




Coastal Planning and ICZM

 DMAPs for nearshore areas (up to 3 nautical miles)

• Joint DMAPs (e.g. Galway Bay, Shannon Estuary)

 Potential for multistakeholder coastal partnerships
